Or So It Seems

Yes, it seems like one event will lead your mind back to a previous one. At least it does that for me.

As you will see as you read through this newsletter, there was an event held on July 24th in Sterling, Alaska, called Salute to Vets Rally, organized by the South Peninsula A.B.A.T.E. and American Legion. The Kenai River QOV group was invited to award Quilts of Valor® to several of the attendees. After the awards, nineteen veterans and their friends and families stopped by to thank the quilters and ask how to nominate others. "You'll never know how much this means to the veterans," one woman told me.

Now, this is what led my mind back to a previous ceremony - one for other veterans who love to feel the wind on their face and freedom of the road.

In 2018 the Forget Me Not Quilters of Alaska had worked together to make motorcycle panel quilts for the Combat Veteran Motorcycle Association (CVMA) members, chapter 43-3 in Wasilla. When we finally had enough quilts made, I called the CVMA Commander and said, "Let's do it!"

At that point, the commander called on his crew to join him at the VFW Post 9365 in Wasilla. He didn't say why, just "be there." The sound of 25 motorcycles pulling into the parking lot still rings in my ears. These men and women had thought they were being called upon to work for someone at the VFW, but instead, we were there to thank them for their service. They excitedly accepted their quilts, each one hugging the quilter who had made their quilt as it was wrapped around their shoulders. As the last quilt was awarded, one man called out, "Can we hug 'em now?" It was like a receiving line as the quilters lined the side of the room and each veteran hugged each quilter!

So often a veteran will express their thanks for their Quilts of Valor® saying, "You'll never know how much this means." My answer to each veteran is that we receive much more than we give. You have offered your life for us. We offer these QOVs as a tangible thank you wrapped around your shoulders as our way of showing our appreciation. May your QOV bring you comfort and healing, just as it did for us, as we sewed each stitch.


